Nonetheless, an estimated 19,000 cases of smallpox occurred among the troops, with approximately 7,000 deaths (5, 13, 17, 25, 26). In the Spanish-American War of 1898, volunteer troops were vaccinated against smallpox as they mustered into service. More smallpox cases occurred among these new volunteers than among the Regular Army.
