Runway construction activities result in changes to the runway environment and performance considerations, potentially increasing risk if the changes are not effectively communicated.

Line Up and Wait Phraseology Change. Beginning on September 30, 2010, the words "Position and Hold" will no longer be used to instruct a pilot to enter the runway and await takeoff clearance. Under the new "Line Up and Wait" phraseology, the controller will: State the call-sign. State the departure runway. State "Line Up and Wait".
