How complementary medicines are regulated in Australia. Australia has a risk-based approach with a two-tiered system for the regulation of all medicines, including complementary medicines: Lower risk medicines can be listed on the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods (ARTG). Higher risk medicines must be registered on the ARTG.

The European Medicines Agency (EMA) charges and collects fees from pharmaceutical companies for carrying out pharmacovigilance activities..
