Drivers of Health Care Costs

Health care costs in the United States now account for 16 percent of the country's gross domestic product, and per capita health care spending is approximately twice that of other major industrialized countries ().Given that the U.S. system's performance is no better than that of other countries, much of the money must be spent unnecessarily or wastefully (Commonwealth Fund 2008).

Although health care expenditure per capita is higher in the USA than in any other country, more than 37 million Americans do not have health insurance, and 41 million more have inadequate access to care.
